

RANDOM ISLAND ACADEMY RE-ENTRY PLAN 2020-2021

Random Island Academy has set safety as our number one priority heading into the 2020-2021 school year. We look forward to working together to make this school year the best it can be given the following parameters.

Busing	***We know there will be an update at the end of September.

The school catchment area of RIA is Random Island only. The causeway is the physical border between RIA and the Clarenville school system. According to the busing policy and the re-entry plan, busing is only provided to students who are in the RIA catchment area.

All courtesy seats are suspended. Courtesy seats are seats that were previously provided to students who live outside the catchment area and/or within 1.6km of the school building. Bus passes where students would travel on a different bus than the one they are assigned would be also included in the courtesy seat suspension.

ALL bus passes are suspended. Students are only allowed to use their assigned bus stop. No exceptions.

Masks are required for ALL students while travelling on a bus.

Assigned seating will be pre-determined and will be communicated prior to school opening.

Student Entrance/Exit

Entrance and exit of all students will be staggered and supervised to ensure proper physical distance is maintained. One bus will be offloading and loading at a time.

K-3: Enter and exit through primary wing4-9: Enter and exit through main entrance10-12: Enter and exit through high school wing

	Student Drop off: Parents/Guardians who opt to arrange alternate transportation for their child are asked to arrive between 8:30-8:40am. Alternate transportation would be driving their child to school, or the student driving themselves. Students must still enter/exit through their designated area outlined above. Entering: Upon entry to the school, students are to go directly to their assigned locker and then move immediately to their classroom. Exiting: Student exit will be staggered by cohort. When picking up your child during school hours we ask that you use the front door buzzer system, and then proceed to the outside designated entrance door where a teacher will escort your child outside to meet you.
Outdoor Footwear	It is our expectation that ALL students from K-12 will have designated indoor footwear. Outdoor footwear must be removed before entering any classrooms including the gymnasium. This is considered a safety concern and reduces unnecessary cleaning duties by our caretakers.
Lockers	Lockers will be assigned and spaced according to cohort.
Visitors	No visitors, including parents/guardians are permitted to visit the school. Visitors, volunteers, and parents/guardians will not be permitted inside NLESD schools during the COVID-19 public health emergency. The exception to this is parents who may have necessary programming meetings scheduled by school administration, or volunteers as approved by administration if/when needed. If a parent has to pick up their child, school staff will escort the student to the appropriate exit door, where the parent will be waiting outside.

	Physical distancing will be maintained as much as physically possible. Some classrooms will still have group seated tables and students will be seated 1m apart whenever possible.		
	Seating arrangements will be pre-determined prior to school opening for every cohort. Students will only use one seat. This seat will be the same for every course.		
	The movement of cohorts will be limited. Students stay within their cohort and classroom as much as possible and teachers will move to them. Exceptions will be made for CDLI students and physical education classes.
